Payment of subscriptions are due and payable by 1 April

Payments may be made by the following methods:

Monthly payment options are available with a surcharge of \$7.50 per month.

Resignation

Any Member intending to resign from the Club is required to notify the Club Manager in writing on or before the 31 March, otherwise they will remain liable for the subscription for the ensuing year.

Email address

Please provide the club with your email address if you have one, and advise the club of any changes, to ensure ongoing receipt of club information and renewal advices. For couples, please ensure an email address is provided for each person (which may be the same). Only essential information and invoices will be posted to members without email addresses recorded.

House and Wallet Accounts

Food and beverage levies included in subscriptions, and credits for long serving members, are added to the member's **House Account**. These credits expire at 1 April each year if not used.

Member account top-up payments are added to the member's **Wallet Account**. For every \$100 added in one day, a bonus credit of \$10 is added for Platinum Members and \$5 for other members.

Competition prize credits are also added to the **Wallet Account**. The **Wallet Account** credit does not expire.

The **House Account** and **Wallet Account** are effectively combined, with purchases in the Bar, Restaurant or Pro Shop debited to the **House Account** first, then the **Wallet Account** once the **House Account** balance reaches zero.

Currently transaction details are only available by request from the office – on line access via the website is not currently available.

Club web site

Members are encouraged to visit the club web site, www.fhgc.com.au, on a regular basis. The web site contains updated event calendars, booking sheets, competition results, news and other information of interest to members, member account information, as well as material of interest to visitors, and other customers.

A PDF version of this handbook is available on-line, which will be updated as required. See also our Handbook information which is kept up to date, including a monthly calendar format, and the ability to link your smartphone calendar to include golf event information.

General Club Rules

Visitors

The Flagstaff Hill Golf Club warmly welcomes all visitors to enjoy our course. At Flagstaff Hill Golf Club, we pride ourselves on being fantastic hosts to golfers of all abilities. Please come and share our club, we're sure you'll love it as much as we do.

Course

Visitors are welcome to use the course, by payment of the relevant green fee, when not reserved for Member's Competitions, Corporate Trade Days or Interclub events. Please contact the Pro Shop to enquire about course availability and make a booking. All members and visitors must report to the Pro Shop prior to commencing their round, at this point any green fees are to be paid by visitors.

Golf Carts are available for hire, we have a range of golf and cart hire specials so please have a word with our friendly Pro Shop staff. You can also stay in touch with Pro Shop specials by following our Facebook page Flagstaff Hill Golf Club Facebook

A visitor who is a member of a reciprocal golf club may play on payment of the green fee as agreed between the two Clubs. A reciprocal Member must make a booking with the Pro Shop and inform them of their reciprocal membership prior to the day of play. A visitor who is a member of a Club Advantage club may play without fee up to 3 times per year, by presenting their current Club Advantage Card, subject to the Club Advantage terms and conditions (refer to the Web site under Membership and later in the handbook).

A visitor who is part of an approved trade day or organised social or similar club event may play under conditions determined for the event. The organiser of the event will be responsible for payment of any relevant green fees to the Club as determined by the Manager.

No visitor shall play in a Saturday competition without special permission from the Captain, President or Manager. Non-Platinum Members may play on Saturdays subject to payment of the applicable green fee of the day and must enter the competition – check with the Pro Shop.

Dress

Course

Our Pro Shop can assist with clothing enquires and offer a range of affordable shirts and pants for purchase. The last thing we want is for you to miss out on playing our course.

Golf Shoes, without metal spikes, are perfect for Course and Practice areas. Sneakers may also be worn. Collared shirts tucked into trousers or shorts with a belt are recommended.

The below are not permitted on the course so please plan:

- Singlets, tank tops or strapless tops
- Sports, gym, boxer or stubby style shorts. Please avoid elastic waistbands
- Jeans and tracksuits

Clubhouse

In the Clubhouse dress should be neat casual. Soft spike golf shoes are permitted in the Member Locker Rooms and Member Lounge room area.

Dress denim jeans are acceptable in the Clubhouse.

Hats or caps are not to be worn within the Clubhouse.

When used for a Special Function the organisers of the function may set their own minimum dress standards in conjunction with the Club Manager.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted at any time anywhere within the Clubhouse, Professional Shop or Locker Rooms. All smokers must use only the butt bins provided and are NOT to smoke on any part of the stair access areas to the clubhouse. The veranda area and walkway between the Professional Shop and Practice Putting Green is a NO SMOKING zone.

Glass containers

Please **do not take glass bottles** or containers onto the Course. Broken glass and discarded bottles can be dangerous to staff and players, and metal bottle tops carelessly discarded can damage mowers.

Alcohol on the Course

The Club's liquor licence only permits alcohol purchased from The Club to be consumed on the course. A range of drinks in non-glass containers is available from the Bar and Pro Shop. BYO alcohol is not permitted on the course. by law.

Etiquette

Please always respect others on the Course and in the Clubhouse. We all want to have fun and enjoy our terrific facilities as members and guests.

Our staff also work very hard to deliver the best possible experience for everyone, please respect them and their position at the Club.

Course etiquette

- Please do not move, talk, stand close to or directly behind when a player is addressing the ball or making a stroke.
- Please be at the tee 10 minutes before hitting off time and hit off
 without delay as soon as the group in front is clear of the hitting range.
 If unable to take your place in the field, please notify the Pro Shop as
 soon as possible.
- Please maintain your speed of play to keep up with the group ahead in the interest of all players. A 2-stroke penalty for slow play may be imposed under rule 5.6.
- The player with the lowest handicap shall be the Captain of the match and is responsible for the observance of the Rules of Golf, Local Rules and Course Etiquette.
- Remember to check the Local Rules Board for Temporary Local Rules prior to every game. This may be to your advantage!
- Please carry a bucket of sand to fill all divot holes.

- Please keep Buggies and Carts off tees and greens and immediate surrounds, in order to preserve the playing surface. Carts should be driven in the rough, or across fairways at right angles all year round to minimise damage in hot or wet conditions.
- Please repair ball marks in the green before leaving to play the next hole. Repair a plug mark by moving turf sideways with a pitch repair fork, rather than by lifting, as the latter breaks the roots causing the turf to die and leaves a damaged area that takes longer to recover. Do not mark your ball by scratching the green.
- Please rake foot and club marks before leaving a bunker. Use the
 prongs for the base of the bunker and the back of the rake for slopes.
 Please enter and exit bunkers from the lowest points, and do not walk
 up the face of bunkers, except when playing the ball. Please leave
 rakes in the flat area of the bunker, prongs down, facing along the line
 of play. A rake left on the slope can leave a following player with a
 difficult shot.
- Please take care to avoid damage to the edge of the hole or the green surface when removing or replacing the flag stick or with shoe sprigs.
 Please avoid using the putter head to lift the ball from the cup as damage to the edge of the hole may result.

Calling Up or Going Through Procedures:

Under the Rules of Golf, the time allowed for searching for a lost ball is now only 3 minutes. Please consider using the new local rule allowing play from the vicinity of the lost ball for a 2 stroke penalty, and avoid the delay of returning to the tee. Calling up the group behind should rarely be necessary.

If your group is looking for a ball, and the group behind is ready to hit, call them up to save time, if it is safe to do so. If your group is significantly behind, call the following group through, only if it will save time, otherwise proceed as soon as possible.

Par 3's: Players may call up at their discretion on par 3 holes, if it will save time. The group calling up must be standing in a safe location, and the group on the tee must not play until called. The safety of players is of paramount importance, and players should always appreciate that they are responsible for their own safety.

Competition competitors have "right of way" on the course at all times. All Saturday players are required to enter the Competition of the Day.

Please pick up when strokes are exhausted with respect to Par and Stableford competitions. Players not playing in the Competition of the Day are to play Stableford. Non-competition Stroke play is only allowed when playing to obtain a handicap, when a maximum of three shots more than par is allowed.

Safety notice

The Occupational Health, Safety and Welfare Act require the Club to maintain a safe working environment.

The Board of Management expects players to co-operate to ensure we have a safe working environment for our Grounds Staff. The main points are as follows:-

Greens Maintenance – When the flag has been removed, the green is out of play and golfers are NOT to hit to the green until the flag is replaced.

Fairway and Rough Maintenance – Golfers MUST wait for an approaching vehicle or mower to pass behind or out of range before playing their shots. Alternatively, golfers may be called on to play their shots by the operator.

Other Situations – In all other situations golfers MUST receive acknowledgement from grounds staff who are in range before playing a shot.

Early Starts – playing before the nominal start time may expose players to chemicals or interfere with course maintenance and is not permitted without approval from the Pro Shop.

Failure to comply with the above procedures could result in prosecution under the Safework Act.

Access to the course

All players are required to report to the Pro Shop before commencing play, regardless of whether they are playing in a competition.

Competition players and players booked on-line have priority over casual play. Always check with the Pro Shop if not booked, to see whether other groups are booked in, whether there is a "shotgun start" scheduled that

would prevent completion of a round, or whether course works impact on play.

Playing earlier than the Pro Shop opening time must be by prior approval, as course works such as chemical spraying may preclude early access to the course for safety reasons or to protect greens. Course maintenance is planned assuming players conform to the booking sheet. Unauthorised early players may be asked to return to the clubhouse.

Playing rights for different membership types, including days and times, and green fees for upgrades to other times, are defined on the club website under Membership, and are available from the Pro Shop.

Competitions

The integrity and fairness of competitions requires all players to adhere strictly to the Rules of Golf and the conditions of the competition. The Board of Management may alter competition conditions as deemed necessary.

Score cards - Rule 3

It is the responsibility of all players under the rules to ensure that their name, date and correct handicap are clearly shown on the card and that the correct strokes taken is recorded for each hole and the card is signed by both the player and marker.

For all competitions, the **actual strokes taken** must be recorded, with a W or dash for a wipe / pickup. Par or Stableford points may be recorded for your own information and checking purposes but are not used in score entry.

The overall score at the top of the card should be the net score in a stroke competition, or Stableford points in a Stableford competition. For Par mark 0 for square.

Markers should record their own scores in the area provided, and write their name and handicap on the card as Marker, to facilitate checking.

The player and marker should **check their strokes taken on each hole** on both cards. The computer will work out Stableford points or PAR result, and totals, it is the **STROKES TAKEN** that are entered into the computer. If you sign a card having a lower strokes taken than you actually had, you

are subject to disqualification under the rules of golf, rule 3.3b(3), regardless of whether you record the correct Stableford points.

A common error arises when the marker records the wrong strokes but the correct Stableford points, and if the player and marker only compare the Stableford points, the error will be undetected until scores are entered into the computer.

Eagles and Hole In Ones are normally detected automatically but should also be indicated at the top of the card and drawn to the attention of Professional Shop staff. This also ensures incorrect scores do not show as eagles, eg if two holes are in the wrong order and show 3 on a par 5!

Please hand your card to Pro Shop staff, or if absent, place in the box provided or under the Pro Shop door.

Please submit ALL scores, **even if the round is not completed**, as all competition entrants must be accounted for by Pro Shop staff.

Results

Competition results will be listed on the club Web Site (www.fhgc.com.au). Results will also be emailed to players having an email address recorded by the club. Results published by Newspapers may be restricted by their editorial policies.

Competition prizes

All prize credits will be credited to the member's electronic "wallet account" and may be redeemed through the Club Professional Shop or the Club Food & Beverage Services. Printed vouchers will be held by the Pro Shop for visitors who win a prize. There may be a few day's delay in crediting prizes.

Choice of Tees

The World Handicapping System adjusts Daily Handicaps based on the course played in a way that net or Stableford/Par scores on any course are equivalent, allowing players to choose between Blue, White and Red tees for Men and Red tees for Women (also White tees for Midweek comps). Refer to the Handicaps section below).

Male players who have difficulty scoring well on the Blue course are encouraged to play the White or Red course when available.

The choice of tees varies from day to day. Blue tees are usually confined to Wednesdays and Saturdays to limit wear. Some competitions do not offer the choice of tees due to limited demand. Please consult the Pro Shop for details applicable on a specific day. The following is a general guide to tee choices available:

Results display and Leaderboard

Competitions which include multiple tee combinations, including 9 hole competitions combining front and back nine's, combine all players into a single field for the purpose of prize allocations and the published results of prize winners.

Limitations of the Leaderboard software mean that only a "main" combination such as Blue Men and Red Women, or White Men and Red Women, are combined on the Leaderboard display. Results for other tees are displayed separately.

Grades

Only the Tuesday Women's 18 hole competition and the Saturday main competition have prizes allocated in A, B, C grade, but Nearest The Pin competitions use A, B, C grades for Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Saturdays and Sundays/Public Holidays.

Grade ranges for Tuesday Women's competitions are A: up to 22, B:23-29, C: 30 and over.

For all other competitions the ranges are A: up to 12, B: 13-18, C: 19 and over for all players.

Competition days

The requirement to enter competitions as described below applies unless the player is having a card marked in order to obtain a new handicap or reinstate a lapsed handicap.

Women's competitions - Tuesdays

The main Women's competition is held Tuesday morning. Details are included in the Women's competition details later.

Nine Hole Seniors Competitions – Tuesdays And Thursdays

The Seniors normally play 9 hole competitions on Tuesdays from 12:15 to 1:00 pm from the 1st & 10th tees, and Thursdays at 10:00am from the 1st tee. Other special events apply as published in the handbook.

All Members over 55 years of age are welcome to play – registration in the Bar. Please see the Nine Hole Seniors page on the website.

Wednesday Competitions (except public holidays)

Wednesday competitions are mixed gender and are conducted as one grade. Men have the choice of Blue, White or Red tees.

Competition players have priority use of both tees until 3.00pm or until such time as the tee is free from players continuing their competition round. Any player using the time sheet to reserve a tee time before 3.00pm must enter the competition of the day, except for a visitor introduction on Wednesday Guest Day (usually the first Wednesday of each month or as identified in the program), or other approved reason including match play finals rounds and Golf SA events.

For Stroke rounds, an alternate Stableford competition will also be offered.

All players will also be eligible for NTP on the 9th hole in 3 grades.

Saturday competitions

Saturday competitions will generally be conducted separately for each grade, with a sponsored prize for the overall winner as a wallet account credit. Men and Women are combined in a single competition, and use the same handicap range for grades (up to 12 for A grade, 13..18 for B grade, 19+ for C grade. Men have the choice of Blue, White or Red tees.

The number of winners and voucher values will be adjusted pro-rata based on the number of players in each grade. In the event the field is very small, a combined all-grades competition will be held.

Stroke rounds will have results reported as the net score relative to par, which overcomes the difference in par between men's courses and the women's course.

For Monthly Medal events, prizes will also be awarded for the best gross score relative to par in each grade, determined by countback if necessary. Members of the PGA (Professionals) are not eligible.

For Stroke rounds, an alternate Stableford competition will also be offered - players will also be eligible for NTP and 2nd shot NTP.

Players in other competitions such as Men's Foursomes are not eligible for any NTP or eagle prizes, but Hole in One's will be recognised if advised to the Pro Shop.

Any player using the time sheet to reserve a tee time must enter the competition of the day.

Sunday And Public Holiday competitions

Mixed gender competitions are conducted on Sundays and Public Holidays, in a single grade, with score adjustment as per the Golf Australia guidelines. Men have the choice of Red or White Tees.

Junior Competitions

A 9 hole Junior Competition will be held at 3.30pm on Saturday afternoons based on demand. Any junior with a GA Handicap is welcome to play in the regular Saturday 18 hole competition, however juniors with a GA Handicap higher than that of A or B Grade must have an accompanying adult in their playing group.

Nearest the Pin Competitions

Nearest the pin (NTP) competitions may be conducted in conjunction with other competitions, with prizes for each grade. Eligibility is by grade, based on the respective handicap ranges for Men and Women In addition, for Saturdays only, a NTP competition is held for all players. No additional entry fee is required. For Saturdays, NTP will apply to the 7th (A Grade), 3rd (B Grade), 9th (C Grade) and 13th (All Players). For other days all NTP competitions will be based on the 9th hole.

An eligible player whose ball is closer to the pin than currently marked, or first on the green, will place the marker immediately behind the ball position. The position should be marked a putter head away while putting and moved back after putting. Please do not scratch a mark on the green. Please record the player's name on the sheet provided. In the case of a hole in one, remove the marker from the green, clip to the NTP sign, and write "Hole in one" on the NTP sheet as well as the scorecard.

NTP competitions will be cancelled if the number of players is too small to fund prizes. If no eligible players land on the green, the NTP prize will lapse. Members of the PGA (Professionals) are not eligible to enter the Nearest the Pin Competition.

Eagle and Hole In One Prizes

Prizes will be awarded for eagles and hole-in-one if the player is playing in a club competition. Hole in one prizes supersede Eagle prizes. Eagles and Hole in One scores will normally be automatically identified by the hole by hole score entry system, but must be confirmed from the actual score card, and should be drawn to the attention of Pro Shop staff when submitting scores. Hole-in-one achievements in competitions such as foursomes and match play events must be advised to the Pro Shop separately. Players and markers must sign the card in accordance with the rules of golf.

Failure to complete a round, or picking up in a Stroke competition, does not disqualify players from NTP, Eagle and Hole in One prizes.

Saturday 2nd Shot Nearest The Pin Prizes

Subject to support by Club Sponsors, a graded 2nd shot NTP will be offered on designated holes of a Saturday Competition. If no player lands on the green in a grade, the prize will jackpot. The holes are currently:

12th Hole: A Grade only – Sponsored by Ray White Real Estate (James Leo)

6th Hole: B & C Grade only – Sponsored by Ray White Real Estate (James Leo)

16th Hole: A, B & C Grade – Sponsored by Alsco / Fresh & Clean

Mid-week 18 hole competition

An 18 hole Stableford competition is conducted on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, with the scores combined for a "mid-week" competition for prizes. Results are published against the Friday results on the website. This competition is open to men and women. Players may participate on multiple days and each round is identified by a day suffix.

Weekly 9 hole competition.

For players who don't wish to play 18 holes, a weekly 9 hole competition will be run, available every day subject to tee availability – please check with the Pro Shop. These competitions will be available for front and back nines, and the results of rounds from Saturday through to the following Friday will be combined and published with the mid-week 18 hole results.

Nine hole competitions are handicapped by Golf Australia by pairing separate competitions to form an 18 hole comp.

Summer Twilight Competition.

During daylight saving, a nine hole twilight mixed competition is held on nominated Thursday afternoons, commencing at 3:00pm – refer to online booking sheets and website under Golf / Special Competitions / Twilight Season. Players may tee off from the 1st or 10th tee. Bookings may be made on-line but are not required. A nine hole card will be printed on registration (different for the front and back nines) - please advise the Pro Shop which nine you are playing. The competition is Stableford, and strokes are awarded based on the normal full handicap against the normal stroke index. Players should submit their cards to the Pro Shop if finishing before close, or by placing their cards in the box provided in the bar (if open) or under the Pro Shop door. A computer in the bar is provided for player score entry, to enable immediate update of the Leaderboard.

A season prize for Twilight is awarded based on the lowest average score of the best 10 rounds for those who have played least 10 rounds.

Future changes to competitions

Details described in this handbook in relation to competition types and times reflect practice at the time of publication and may be changed by the Board of Management after publication. Please refer to the website and booking sheets, or the Pro Shop for up-to-date information.

Handicaps

The World Handicap System is now in use and managed by Golf Australia www.golf.org.au, where detailed information is available. The maximum Australian daily handicap is 54 for men and women. A player's playing handicap is the **DAILY HANDICAP** as calculated in relation to the Par, slope rating, and scratch rating of the course and tee colour played.

For courses with a scratch rating different from Par, the difference is added to or subtracted from the daily handicap to allow scores from different courses to be combined without score adjustment, as for mixed gender competitions.

The Daily HC is calculated from the following formula:

(GA Handicap x slope / 113 + Scratch - Par) x 0.93.

The result is rounded, with 0.5 rounding up. For so-called "Plus Handicaps" (a negative number), 0.5 rounds towards 0.

The Daily HC depends on the course being played, and for 9 hole competitions, which nine. The Daily Handicap will be printed on competition scorecards as an 18 hole handicap.

If playing in events that do not generate a printed card, or playing other courses, players should check the noticeboard charts, or ask pro shop staff, to ascertain their daily playing handicap.

NOTE FOR STROKE ROUNDS: when a player in a stroke round is disqualified after picking up their ball, the player should continue to record the strokes taken at the completion of the round as the Stableford score calculated by the system is used for handicapping. If no scores are entered the score is recorded as a "NSN" and is not available for handicap purposes. The Australian handicap system requires no more than four NSN rounds in the players last 20 rounds. A player with 5 or more NSN rounds in the last 20 will have their handicap marked as 'Provisional" and may be excluded from winning competition prizes.

Players without a handicap must submit the equivalent of three 18 hole rounds (or an equivalent combination of 9 hole rounds), using Stableford scoring on the basis of a handicap of 54. Golf Australia will allocate a handicap and a GolfLink number when the three rounds have been posted. Scorecards must be signed by the player and marker. Please consult the Pro Shop for detailed information about obtaining a handicap.

Rules Relating To Conditions Of Play

Method of Countback (Golf Aust Recommendation)

18 Hole Events

1st Countback - 10th - 18th (last 9 holes, 10..18)

2nd Countback – 13th to 18th holes (last 6 holes,13..18)

 3^{rd} Countback – 16^{th} to 18^{th} holes (last 3 holes, 16..18). If still tied – 18^{th} hole backwards to 1st, hole by hole

For Stroke competitions, the countback is based on the net score per hole based on the relevant Stroke Index (new from 2020).

27, 36 and 72 Hole Events

The last 18 holes shall be used and if still tied the countback for 18 hole events is to apply using the last 18 holes.

9 Hole Events

1st Countback - last 6 holes played

 2^{nd} Countback – last 3 hole. If still tied – backwards, hole be hole, from last hole of play.

Conditions for Knockout Match Play Events

All Knockout Matches, other than Club Championships, can be played on a mutually convenient day on or before the designated completion date. If a mutually convenient time is not able to be agreed then the allocated time on the designated completion date MUST be used to conduct the match. Any player not available at this time will record a forfeit for their match play round.

Method of Deciding Ties

All ties in Knockout Matches must proceed in order, hole by hole, until a decision is reached.

All other ties shall be decided in such manner as the Match Committee determines.

Handicaps for Multi-Round Events

For Handicap Match Play, the current daily handicap applicable on the first day of match play will apply.

For grade based events including Club Championships and Captain's Trophy, the grade will be based on the handicap of the first round. For subsequent rounds the current Golf Australia Daily handicap will be used for scoring.

Match Index

For Handicap Match Play, the lowest handicap of the pair is deducted from both handicaps, so the order of giving strokes is based on the difference in handicaps, using the Match Play index as published by Golf Australia, listed below:

Protests

A protest in connection with any competition or match shall be made in writing to the Club Manager immediately on completion of the game.

Closing Dates

No LATE ENTRIES will be accepted after the closing date with the exception that, at the discretion of the Match Committee, a late entrant may be considered as a reserve and fill a vacant position. All entries must be accompanied by the nominated fee for the entry to be accepted.

Local Rules

Local Rules are as printed on the Score Card and Temporary Local Rules posted on the Notice Board adjacent to the Pro Shop entrance, and Club Website. The Temporary local rules published on the Notice Board are official and over-ride local rules on the scorecard and website.

Electric Carts

Electric carts are available for hire by any player. Motorised carts may be used in all competitions with the exception of the Honour Board events involving 36 hole play in one day, where a suitable medical certificate will be required to be presented to the General Manager prior to the event. The following event requires a medical certificate:

Men's Club Championships (ie A Grade)

Please keep carts away from greens, bunkers and tee blocks and their surrounds, and observe signs and roped off areas indicating where carts should be driven. Please keep carts in the rough as much as possible, or if crossing a fairway, do so at right angles. This will minimise damage to fairways, especially in hot weather or extremely wet conditions. The objective is to preserve the condition of the fairways to improve the golfing experience – we all benefit from protecting our fairways by minimising cart damage.

Extreme temperature (heat)

The club administration recommends that members and visitors do not play under conditions of high temperatures. Any person who plays in high temperatures does so at their own risk.

Should the temperature be forecast 38.0°C or above by the Bureau of Meteorology for Noarlunga, the following will apply:

- 1.1 The last tee off time will be 8.45 am.
- 1.2 On days where the forecast temperature exceeds 38.0°C or above. the use of golf carts may be limited or excluded at the discretion of Management, Chair of Match & Greens and Pro Shop staff.
- 1.3 Regardless of the guidelines, the General Manager, Captain and/or the Chair of Match and Greens have ultimate responsibility to make any decision banning the use of motorised carts or cancelling play for all golfers.

This information will be available from the Pro Shop staff on the day of play. Alternative directions may be posted on the noticeboard and website under certain conditions and carts may be completely banned in extremely hot days.

On any day when the forecast temperature is 36C or more, carts must be driven in the rough as much as possible.

Lightning - Discontinuance of play

Refer to Rules of Golf rule 5.7

If lightning around the Golf Course presents a danger, then the "Course Protocol: Cancelled or Suspended Play" will be enforced. A decision will be made by authorised personnel, taking into consideration weather forecasts and trends, as well as, appropriate discussions with authorities. Any player who continues to play once play has been suspended or cancelled will be disqualified. Always remember:

- If you are concerned about lightning, make your way as quickly as possible to the clubhouse or Pro Shop.
- If caught on the course and unable to get off, do not stand under tall trees or sit in a golf cart.
- Get away from your cart and golf clubs. Do not use an umbrella.
- Stay away from water.
- · Remove any metal spiked shoes.
- Get down low, Crouch on the balls of your feet (reduces your contact with the ground)
- Hands should be kept on your knees rather than touching the ground.
- Do not use your mobile phone.
- 3. Course Unplayable

If any of the club's authorized personnel consider the course to be in an unplayable condition or that there are circumstances that render the proper playing of the game impossible, they may, order a temporary suspension or cancellation of play, refer to "Course Protocol: Cancelled or Suspended Play"

CANCELLED OR SUSPENDED PLAYPOLICY

This policy covers the situation where play for the Club's competition of the day is required to be cancelled or suspended. The reasons for the cancellation or suspension may include but is not limited to: the course is deemed unplayable or unsafe due to lightning, storms resulting in flooding, heat stress on the course or a serious accident causing a hole or

holes to be taken out of play. Refer Club Policy on Extreme Weather, and R&A Rules of Golf 5.7.

The following people are authorised (in order) providing that these persons are located at the clubhouse at the time of the decision, to determine if the competition is to be cancelled or suspended for a determined period of time and for the resumption of play.

Club Manager, Club Professional, Pro Shop Staff, any member of the Match & Greens Committee or Board of Management.

Suspension and Resumption of Play

Procedure for suspension and resumption of play to be in accordance with rule 5.7 and the Recommendations for Lightning as documented in the Extreme Weather Policy.

Players are to be notified of the state of play by way of the following sirens:

- One 10 second long blast will be sounded on the siren to SUSPEND play. Players to cease play, mark & lift your ball & briskly return to the Clubhouse or a point of safety.
- Two 3 second short blasts on the siren to RESUME play. Refer procedure under rule 5.7c,d.
- Three 3 second short blasts, will be sounded on the siren to indicate that play has been CANCELLED.

It is against the rules of golf to continue play once play is suspended. If in DOUBT players should MARK their golf ball and wait for the decision to be clarified.

This is particularly relevant to short downpours of rain which can leave our greens temporarily flooded and unplayable. If relief can be taken to provide an unimpeded line of putt to the hole, play does not need to be suspended. However, if any greens become unplayable due to no access to relief, play will be temporarily suspended until the affected greens drain satisfactorily.

If play has been SUSPENDED, the authorised person(s) shall review this decision at 30 minute intervals, or at an appropriate lesser interval where play has been suspended because of flooded greens

If time does not permit those players whose play has been suspended to complete their round, the remaining play will be deemed to be cancelled.

Should play RESUME and a player choose not to proceed, that player shall be disqualified from the competition per rule 5.7c.

Any player who continues to play once play has been suspended or cancelled will be DISQUALIFIED, per Rule 5.7b.

Competition Management

Those players unable to finish their rounds when the competition has been CANCELLED, will have their entrance fee credited to the following club competition of the same weekday.

If the competition was also a major Club event, including trophy events and club championships, then the Match Committee will decide whether the event is to be rescheduled or abandoned.

Providing 2 or more players can complete the round, the competition will be deemed valid for those having completed the round at the time of play being cancelled.

Permanent Booking Sheets

A permanent booking sheet currently operates on Saturdays, with bookings available to Platinum (Cat A) Members only. Platinum members listed on the Permanent Booking Sheet will be automatically booked in at their allocated tee times, and are required to either cancel their own booking online or notify the Professional Shop or Office if they are unable to play. Such notification should be made at the earliest opportunity, to allow other members to play in lieu. These bookings can only be cancelled by the player, the Pro Shop or Office.

If you plan to be absent for a while, and are unable to remove your own name on-line, please advise the Pro Shop of details, by phone, email or in person. Players who repeatedly fail to cancel when not playing may be removed from the Permanent Booking Sheet.

Foursomes, Ambrose and Similar Events

Foursomes (Rule 22)

Two (2) players play as partners using one ball and tee off alternately and thereafter strike the ball alternately during the play of each hole.

Score as stroke round with the **nett** total subject to a deduction of ½ the partner's aggregate handicaps.

NOTE: Where either player incurs a penalty stroke the rotation of play is not altered. In a foursome stroke play competition consisting of more than one round the order of play may be changed between rounds unless the Conditions of Play require that the original order of play must be maintained throughout the competition.

Where booking sheets apply, the first two and last two names for a given tee time define the teams as assumed by Golf Operations software. For multi-round events such as Men's Foursomes, booking sheet entries for both rounds must match, or be adjusted by the Pro Shop to match the team compositions for the first round.

Mixed Foursomes

Mixed foursomes are played in a similar manner as foursomes except that the women use their tees when it is their turn to play.

The Committee shall determine as a Condition of Play whether the man or woman is required to play from the first tee; and in competitions played under stroke conditions and consisting of more than one round, whether this order is to be maintained

Canadian Foursomes

Played as above except that both players play tee shots at each hole and thereafter continue with a selected ball. Handicap allowance is ½ the aggregate stroke handicap for stroke competitions.

Pinehurst

Both players play tee shots at each hole and then play their second stroke with the partner's ball. One ball is then selected and play proceeds as in foursomes with the owner of the ball selected playing the third stoke. Handicap allowance is ½ the aggregate stroke handicap for stroke competitions.

Ambrose

The team selects a captain who is responsible for the method of play, marking of the card and determining the order of play.

All players hit off from the tee and the captain then decides which ball is in the best position.

The position of the selected shot is marked. Each team member may then place their ball within one club length of the marked position, no nearer the hole, and play from this position.

If the selected shot is on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in a hazard, bunker or rough, the ball must be placed within one club length of the selected shot, no nearer the hole, and must remain on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in the hazard, bunker or rough. In a sand bunker, the sand may be raked prior to any ball being placed. On the putting surface the selected ball is marked, and balls must be placed within one putter head length of that spot no nearer the hole.

Team members may stand behind one another while hitting a shot or putting

Ambrose is scored as a stroke net event and handicapping for a four-ball is 1/8 sum of stroke handicap, or 1/6 for 3 players. Other methods of determining team handicaps may be applied as recommended by Golf Australia or as determined for specific events. Each player must have his/her handicap, and the team handicap recorded on the card. At the completion of the event a member of the team signs the card.

For Ambrose competitions conducted through our Golf Operations software, teams will be determined from the names on the booking sheet, and a team card (with team handicap) will be printed when the first player registers. **Any changes to team composition MUST be made on the booking sheet** before the first player registers, refer to Pro Shop staff for assistance.

For some events a maximum handicap may be specified – please refer to the conditions of entry for the specific event.

Monthly Medal and Medal of Medals

Monthly medallists shall be those players in each grade who have the best net score on the designated monthly stroke round. A count-back shall be applied in the event of a tie. The final shall be played Saturday 3 December 2022 for the previous 12 medallists per grade (December 2021 - November 2022). Players who win monthly medals in more than one grade are eligible for each such grade in the finals. A count-back shall be applied in the event of a tie. Men and Women are eligible.

The Max Brown Perpetual Trophy

Perpetual Cup donated by Life Member Max Brown: two ball aggregate played in conjunction with the regular Saturday Stableford event on 27 August 2022. Players play in pairs, and each pair should record their individual and aggregate scores on each hole, on a separate card from the normal competition. Pairs must be determined prior to commencement of play. Where a group has only three players, only one pair may submit a card. The winning pair is the one with the highest aggregate stableford score, subject to normal count-back rules. No additional entry fee is payable.

Perpetual Cup donated by Life Member David Pank (dec): winner of a selected Stableford Round (in place of previous 4-ball best ball teams event).
